Application and safety Instructions



Backpacks

Congratulations on the purchase of this backpack. To ensure this product gives you long service, it is essential to observe the following safety instructions:

Adjust the arm straps so that the backpack sits comfortably and securely on your back. If the backpack has adjustable closure straps, adjust them so that the backpack is suitably stiff and will not flap on your motorbike. Use the waist belt (if fitted) to make the backpack more secure and comfortable on your back.

Do not transport heavy loads in the backpack. The maximum load of 5 kg must not be exceeded. Always pack heavy objects at the bottom and light ones at the top.

Do not use the backpack for transporting pointed or sharpedged objects or any other object that could cause injury to yourself or others.

Backpacks with a hardshell back may be scratched if handled incorrectly. Always set the backpack down carefully, not on the hardshell side, and do not secure rough or angular objects in the outer cargo net (if fitted).

This backpack is made of water-repellent (not 100% waterproof) materials. When riding in the rain, it is important to use a rain cover and to protect the contents from moisture using, waterproof bags (e.g. from the Louis range) or a plastic bag.

At high speeds, strong air turbulence occurs at the edge of the backpack on your back. This can cause the zips to open unexpectedly, so you should always close the zips at the base of the backpack (see Fig. 1 and 2).

Before setting off, always check that all the zips and snap closures are securely closed and cannot come open while the motorbike is moving. We recommend additionally securing the zips with a mini-padlock, safety pin or piece of string.

Please make sure that horizontal zippers are closed and the puller is fully tucked away under the wind guard (see Fig. 1 and 2).

For safety reasons, you must not transport any objects in an outer cargo net (if fitted) on the backpack while riding your motorbike.

Backpacks can affect the handling of the motorcycle and impair the safety of the rider, so you must not exceed 120 km/h (approx. 62 mph). Adapt your riding style to the change in handling caused by the backpack.

Backpacks are not designed for securing to a motorbike (luggage rack, seat, tank etc.). Always wear the backpack on your back when riding your motorbike.

Clean the textile backpack by hand. To remove dirt, gently rub with a soft brush or a damp cloth with water. After cleaning, apply textile proofer (e.g. from the Louis range) to weatherproof the backpack and restore its water- and dirt-repellent properties.

Take time to prepare your backpack carefully for your next trip, and always follow the above safety instructions. Inappropriate or incorrect handling will void all guarantee claims.
